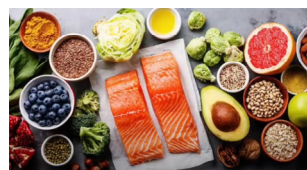

Launched in 2018 on World Water Day, our annual Water Warrior Award is presented each year at The Water Docs Film Festival to an individual who has made an outstanding contribution to protecting and raising awareness about threats and issues facing water. The award has been designed to highlight the work of someone who exemplifies and embodies Ecologos' mission – namely, to restore the human connection to water while motivating people to take action to protect our planet's most precious element.

Ecologos commissioned a local Toronto glass artist - Aurora Darwin - to design and create the awards that will be given each year to the selected water warrior. Aurora was featured in the documentary The Peel Project, which had its Toronto premiere at the 2017 Water Docs Film Festival. During the premiere, Aurora displayed some of her artwork, inspired by her journey down the Peel River Watershed during the making of the documentary. We worked with Aurora to design a beautiful glass wave, capturing the powerful ability inherent in art to move hearts and minds to take action for water.

The inaugural Water Warrior Award was presented to Canadian activist, author and National Chairperson of the Council of Canadians, **Maude Barlow** followed in 2019 by two special water warriors whose powerful message about water has rippled through communities around the world: **Grandmother Josephine Mandamin** and her great niece, **Autumn Peltier**.

In 2020 the award is being presented to **Captain Paul Watson**, the subject of the documentary film **WATSON**, screening on Wednesday, November 4 (see page 12 for details). (Please see facing page for more information.)

CAPTAIN PAUL WATSON

This year the Water Docs Film Festival is awarding **Captain Paul Watson** with the 2020 Water Warrior Award. A lifetime marine wildlife conservationist and environmental activist, Watson was one of the founding members and directors of Greenpeace. The president of Ecuador bestowed Watson with the *Amazon Peace Prize* in 2007 and in 2012 he became only the second person after Captain Jacques Cousteau to be awarded the *Jules Verne Award*, an honour dedicated to environmentalists and adventurers.

In 1977 Watson left Greenpeace and founded the Sea Shepherd Conservation Society. A renowned speaker, accomplished author, master mariner and lifelong environmentalist, Watson has been awarded many honours for his dedication to the oceans and to the planet. Among many commendations for his work, he has received the *Genesis Award for Lifetime Achievement*, was named as one of the *Top 20 Environmental Heroes of the 20th Century* by Time magazine, and has been inducted into the *U.S. Animal Rights Hall of Fame*.

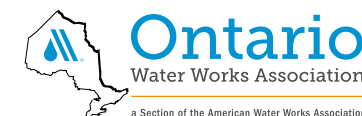

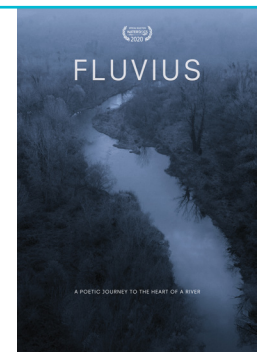

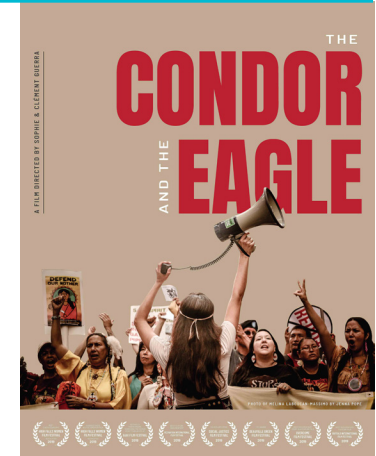

SEA OF SHADOWS follows a team of dedicated scientists, high-tech conservationists, investigative journalists and courageous undercover agents as well as the Mexican Navy as they put their lives on the line to save the last remaining vaquitas and bring the vicious international crime syndicate to justice.

Every year, National Aquarium Animal Rescue cares for dozens of cold-stunned sea turtles after they strand on the shores of Cape Cod amid cold weather snaps. Often suffering from pneumonia and infections when rescued in Massachusetts, the turtles are transported to Baltimore for long-term treatment. Each turtle's path through rehabilitation not only drives home the efforts of conservation efforts worldwide, but also helps connect staff, volunteers, and the public with the natural world, helping to inspire a new way to see the ocean and our connection to it.

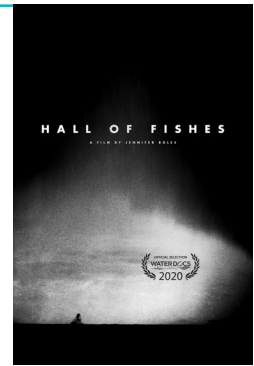

An oil and gas corporation plan to drill 850 wells through the Great Artesian Basin – one of the largest underground freshwater reservoirs in the world – which flows beneath the Pilliga. As a keystone species, beaver enrich their ecosystems, creating the biodiversity, complexity, and resiliency our watersheds need to absorb the impacts of climate change.
